# Repression is not a solution for repression

You may recognize Damien Killeen as a buxom bar wench at KU Lisle Street. But he's also a talented actor and writer. This week he kicks off a new series in which QX looks at gay men's relationship to shame and sexuality...

The problem that a lot of people seem to have within the gay community is that it is not, apparently, a boat. Discreetness is rarely priority and here 'Big ol' Whore' is a clothing brand and the style du jour. I've lost count of the amount of times gay opinion has amounted to 'if gays stopped acting like cum buckets they would be more accepted' or 'gays lack self-respect' or even 'gay men would be treated normally if they acted more normal'. So who defines the concept acceptable? How about self-respect? Normal?

The normative is defined by the majority so I guess that would be straight people. You want me to act like a straight person

so many gay men clamouring for the same thing - really I thought we established some time ago it's not a healthy slogan for us. Repression is not a solution for repression. This system is so all encompassing socially, that a straight person can rarely escape its burden; the drive towards finding a partner, procreating, trying not to smother that partner with a pillow because you have fallen out of lust with them and you think they stole your youth and ambition - it leaves many people shattered and depressed.

Guess what though? The fact you have a dick and you like dick automatically puts you on the other side of that system. Hurrah! Yes, our desperate search for acceptance might lead us to try and

he sense of shame is heavy in the GUM clinic. Conversation is non-existent. Being here is tantamount to wearing a neon sign stating proudly that you have had sex: except no one is proud here. All that excitement and satisfaction you got from fucking Mark from accounts seems out of place. Because you're a whore who

had sex. Talking up sex is great when it's all smoke and mirrors and Malibu and Coke but people really don't like inescapable labels and, so we're told, no one wants damaged goods.

Sexual purity is power. Purity is the commodity you get to trade in at some point for your happily ever after. You accrue purity by being a stranger and you maintain it by being discreet. Now admittedly last weekend you had sex with eighteen teenagers on a boat, but that doesn't count, that was a boat. Who's going to find out about that? Still, here you are, it's Tuesday morning, you're in the

so you have an easier time acting like a straight person. I can like musical theatre and listen to Cher because straights are pretty comfortable with that now, but please don't have too much sex with the wrong people in the wrong places. I've spent the majority of my life thinking the same way so am pretty familiar with the argument and have thus grown into a young man with all the exotic flair of a conservative, Mormon pamphlet distributor. Gays seem to appreciate this and I am often complemented with how 'un-gay' I seem. Wonderful. We can all achieve ungayness and the elusive happiness that must bring. Right?

The system straight society instigated is to idealise sexuality, to control, to moralise, and if in doubt to deny, deny, deny. When the motto does seem to be 'don't ask don't tell' it's fairly odd seeing

emulate that system, to cram ourselves back into it (in general gays love cramming stuff into stuff). However, that system we are so keen to emulate isn't creating happy, satisfied people who understand themselves. Why do we spend time looking to straight models of behaviour when all they bring is stigma and self-hate? If a straight system of identity brings you shame and dissatisfaction then create a new system you can relate to. Sex and relations with others are experiments that offer you the chance of understanding what it is you need from people. They work much better if you offload some of that 'straight' baggage.

Maybe then, when you find yourself on a doctor's table at 9am with a nurse inserting a cotton bud into your butt you could relax, forget shame and take it for what it is - a nice day out of the house.

# The Vito Project Launch





# **ON SATURDAY**

**EVENING**, after braving the West End's swathes of tourists and sale shoppers, we decided to treat ourselves to a nice stiff drink or six in London's oasis of sophistication, Ku Bar Lisle Street!

Ku has a special place in this reviewer's heart as being the first gay bar they ever had the pleasure of throwing back drinks (with a massively muscular Texan man, no less) and our love for it has only grown. Much like the beautiful boys behind the bar, the place has only become hotter and more welcoming over the years.

After staking out our spot at the bar, we ordered up a few refreshments from the tank-top clad totty on hand and sat back to enjoy their signature selection of sexy videos and pop perfection on the bar's array of big screens. Who knew that dissecting an Ariana Grande video could become such serious business after a few gin and tonics?

One of the great things about the Ku brand is the inclusive atmosphere in such exclusively styled surroundings. From the sumptuous Champagne Bar upstairs, to the sleek lines of the main bar and its heated outdoor terrace, your experience is never anything less than high-end without a hint of attitude.





irector and allround young visionary Nick Connaughton proposed that we

make a queer updated version of A Midsummer Night's Dream. My heart sunk. Shakespeare has been updated so often it's virtually the literary equivalent of iOS, and usually arrives with the same amount of glitches and unnecessary annoyance.

But when we painted in more of the project's shades together, seated in the beautiful, sustainable Arcola Theatre itself, the seeds of excitement were sown. Of all Shakespeare's plays, A Midsummer Night's Dream holds an inherent queerness: the experimentation with desire; the misrule of love; the faeries; and the primal, mercurial forest in which the young lovers explore and lose themselves for a night.

Nick's idea was that this wouldn't be a run-of-the-mill production. It would stem from a return to community theatre, bringing together the LGBTPQIA - have I missed any out? - people of London to share their experiences, memories, fears and hopes, creating a reflection of what it is to be queer today.

Calls were put out over social media, on the Arcola website, in this magazine, for anyone interested in being part of the cast. At the first workshop we got a rich turnout, from well-known scene performance faces like

Rubyyy Jones, Pretty Miss Cairo and Rudi Douglas, to Ku Bar's Damien and Zachariah Fletcher from Of Saints and Go-Go Boys, to fresh faces wanting to involve themselves in a new take on an old dream.

As a writer I was tasked with shaping contemporary scenes to sit alongside the Shakespearean text, formed from the community discussions we held in workshops. Here we spoke honestly about how we felt as a gay, or bi, or lesbian, or trans, or female representing, or however-youidentify person in London today. Many issues emerged that I was familiar with as a gay man, and a few that I'd never considered.

In the finished piece we tackle subjects you might expect from queer theatre, such as parental pressures and coming out, but also topics less spoken on the stage: the prevalence of chemsex amongst gay men, the proliferation of genders and identities outside of the binaries we are assigned at birth. It's a metamorphosing blend, designed to provoke thought but also engage empathy from its audience, whether gay, straight or elsewhere on the spectrum.

Diehard Shakespearean purists are probably not going to be creaming in the aisles. And it was hardly a light undertaking to inject my own writing into the revered text of 'the greatest playwright in the world', however, much of the new writing may contain a choric voice at its heart. But what we have tried to do is discern existing

nuances within the characters and grow from these new queered identities, like stem cells nurtured into limbs.

Performance has been intertwined with queer culture from the Dorian Gray Victorian music halls, to the 1930s when 'musical' was a euphemism for 'gay', to the Brixton Fairies' political street theatre of the 60s and 70s, and the exuberant drag of Ru Paul today. LGBT+ theatre groups were fairly prevalent in the 1980s, with a mission of activism, wanting to open eyes. But they splintered as LGBT culture split into different factions.

No one involved with A Midsummer Night's Dream is claiming to be rebuilding the

LGBT+ cultural solidarity with one play. But it has been illuminating to witness a myriad of different people with different identities wanting to come together and create a shared expression.

Theatre, to my mind, is an important tool in joining both cast and audience together in a cathartic moment. You are both in that room, breathing the same air and within that happening. The actors before you are not trapped on the cold celluloid of film but living, pulsing beings, and the vibrations of their throat are the same that quiver in your ear. We'd like for you to join us, to share in our connection, and become a part of our production on being queer in 2015.

# **Health Watch**

Hi Dr Alex,

I've had tattoos for a few years. I started to have them when I was young. One <mark>tatt is visible even whe</mark>n I wear a shirt because it runs up to behind my ear. I hate to bow to convention but I know that some people I want to work with might think a visible tatt is inappropriate. So I am considering having the visible part removed but I wonder how good tatt removal really is? I've seen a few and they look worse than actually having one. Cheers Mr Ink

Inked culture was brought to the West in the 19th century catering mainly to the working class. They were briefly popular with the elite in around 1910 but then remained a symbol that you had been imprisoned (justifiably or unjustifiably) or that you'd served in the military. In the 1980s, punks, gays, and rebellious teenagers had them as a form of social protest. But since then the number of people having tattoos has exploded. Research into the characteristics of people with tattoos show that they are only very slightly less conscientious, more extroverted, more sensation seeking, and feel the need for uniqueness than those who do not have tattoos.


And so they are less and less likely to be seen as anti-establishment as they have become more of a statement of fashion than of rebellion. Although having one, that can never be covered up I think is more a sign of rebellion than one that is easily concealed. And so depending on your career, it could be that future employers might view your visible tattoo as a sign you are a bit too antiestablishment. I'm sure that if I turned up to work with one so visible it would not go down well at all.


The best current treatment to remove a tattoo is laser therapy. This is where pulses of specific wavelengths of light are beamed onto the tattoo and break up the pigment. The surrounding skin does not absorb the light and so remains unharmed. Most people describe the sensation as a rubber band snapping against their skin and so it doesn't usually require an anaesthetic. But if you have a low threshold for pain then an anaesthetic cream can be used.

How well the treatment works and how many sessions you need will depend on the age, size and colour of the tattoo. Black tattoo pigments absorb more wavelengths of light and so are supposed to be easier to remove than coloured ones. Your skin colour and how the tattoo was first done - professional or amateur - will also affect how well it responds to the treatment.

Is it safe? Thankfully, complications are generally minor and rare. But you can get problems like the tattoo becoming paler than your surrounding skin, infection of your tattoo site and even some scarring. Very rarely a raised or thickened scar can appear three to six months after the tattoo is removed. And although effective in most cases it doesn't work for every tattoo, so you may be left with some pigment.

Once you've made up your mind about how significant a compromise it would be to have that part of your inked body erased make sure that you find a reputable dermatologist or cosmetic surgeon who specialises in this kind of work so you get the best treatment.
