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# Asylum in the Scene

Gay venues have long been hailed as safe spaces for the community - and rightly so. But not everyone is benefitting from the sanctuary they offer. Chris Godfrey speaks to LGBT asylum seekers about their positive and negative experiences in the capital's gay bars.

“T

he gay scene where I was born in Pakistan is very terrifying,” says Maajid\*, who came to the UK after being disowned by his family. “If you were having sex with someone and they caught you it’s 200 lashes. I was never attracted to girls and it was very

hard to hide my feelings living in Pakistani culture and society.”

If Maajid thought his arrival in the UK would liberate him from homophobic persecution he was mistaken. While awaiting the outcome of his asylum claim, he lived in shared accommodation run by G4S. He was bullied and threatened with violence by other asylum seekers so regularly he was prescribed anti-depressants. His experiences echo those of many LGBT refugees - not just in the UK, but across Europe. London’s gay scene provided a much-needed safe space.

“It has been very helpful and supportive,” he says. “When I first came here we went everywhere - Late, Ku Bar, all of Soho - I was really happy. When I went for the first time to GAY bar I was just so happy. In Pakistan if you kiss someone they could kill you, but here there’s freedom. It was a good experience. I was happy that no one could stop you from kissing someone. I’m not scared about anyone.”

Paul Dillane, executive director at the UK Lesbian and Gay Immigration Group (UKLGIG), works with many LGBT refugees as their asylum

claims are processed. With many of his clients hailing from some of the most aggressively anti-gay regions, he has witnessed the positive impact London’s gay community can have.

“The scene can be a life changing place for LGBT people who come to the UK from countries like Iran, Uganda and Pakistan,” he says. “To see LGBT people in the UK having the freedom to lead their lives as they wish and in safety, to gather together without fear of being raided and arrested and to openly display their affection, is often a profound experience for the LGBT asylum seekers we work with.”

But while London’s gay scene can be an empowering place for some LGBT asylum seekers, for others it’s just another arena loaded with discrimination.

“London is an extremely diverse city but that is not always reflected in the community,” says Dillane. “Unfortunately, many LGBT asylum seekers and refugees do not feel comfortable going to venues as they perceive they might not be welcome by some punters, whether due to the colour of their skin or their immigration status. Many...have experienced racism and outright hostility on the scene.”

Grace came to the UK over eleven years ago, arriving from Nigeria where all same-sex activity is illegal and homophobia is rife. Though she now has refugee status and has lived in the UK for over a decade, she still feels like an outsider in many venues.

“I used to feel comfortable in a lot of places but things changed,” she says. “Sometimes when you get into the clubs and you get people who are like a clique, everybody knows who they know and they only want to speak to who they know.”

“If you’re new on the scene and you try to talk to someone, you would feel like you’re not in your place. You’re out of it - consciously or unconsciously you’ll be made to realise that you’re out of place. Now I do more in the BME LGBT scene, like Bootylicious and the inclusive Bar Wotever”

As well as contending with the cliquey tribalism of queer London, Grace regularly encounters prejudicial attitudes. Such is their prevalence, they’ve driven her away from venues she once loved.

“Why do you think I don’t go to a lot of these clubs anymore?” she says. “You think that we’re family, so if we’re family the colour of the skin or the accent don’t matter. I tell you something now, even when I’m checking someone out, the moment I start speaking and they get to know you’ve got an accent, they withdraw instantly. That’s all they see - you’re Grace and you have an accent - I said yes I have an accent, I’m Nigerian, I just changed my name because of situations like this.”

Despite attitudes and incidents that have left Grace feeling isolated, London’s LGBT scene has also given her the confidence to be herself and confront her family back home.

“I actually feel stronger now and bold enough to tell them where to go to,” says Grace. “I’ve never been able to do that before. I felt comfortable enough. Before I used to feel so restricted, even in the way I would dress and in my mannerisms and my interactions. I feel more independent and empowered in one way.”

It’s a sentiment shared by Uzza Ali\*, who came to the UK in 2006. When his

student visa expired in 2012, he was faced with returning to Pakistan where his family intended to force him into wedding his female cousin.

“I decided to go for asylum because I didn’t have any other option,” he says. “I belong to a Muslim family and they felt that if I married a woman I would become straight. My brothers sent me threatening emails and tried to tell me what kind of disease I would get if I was to be a gay, because I’m going to the gay scene, because I’m going against the rules of God.”

In a socially conservative Pakistan, where homosexual activity is illegal and relationships are taboo, Ali’s mannerisms made him a target for abuse, particularly from his family.

“I’m very girlish and I can’t bear to do it among the family,” he says. “When I walked my brother would kick me on my toes and say ‘why do you walk like a girl’. When I talk if I use my hand he took my hand and said it’s not a way for men to talk. I always have to listen to my brothers and family, but I want to live the way I am and I want to live to be myself.”

Since arriving in the UK, Ali has eagerly explored London’s scene, going everywhere from Heaven to Disco Rani, a gay club in Ealing for the Asian community. It’s a far cry from the oppressive life he led in Pakistan and, just like Grace and Ali, has helped him to be himself.

“It gave me a power, it gave me a confidence,” says Ali, reflecting on his early trips to the scene. “I met many people on the scene; I made them my friends. I feel so safe and I can do whatever I want to do. No one can stop me. I’m very proud of myself now and a very out person.”

# How Cyberspace Has Made Us Callous

If you downloaded a job application form which said 'no blacks or Asians' you'd no doubt be a bit taken aback, whatever your ethnicity. And if you were one of the ostracised minorities, you'd probably want to report the offender to the appropriate authorities. But you only need to take a casual glance through the plethora of hook-up apps and dating sites to see these exclusionary terms bandied about like confetti.

Let's face it, a fair proportion of men have certain types; some of us have a small range of people we're attracted to, for others it can be much more extensive. I've always found myself drawn to Caucasians (I'm black), but I'd never state that on my profile in a way that is derogatory to others. Nowhere on my PlanetRomeo account do I use prejudicial expressions such as 'no non-whites' or 'fat dudes need not apply'. Nor would I ever.

Regrettably, there are far too many who would. I'm not sure what percentage of individuals using dating apps or sites do use bigoted terminology on their profile, but from what I can see it's quite prevalent. I remember one particular page on Adam4Adam whose owner had a whole list of ridiculous requirements: 'no blacks', 'no Asians', 'no Indians' (clearly not realising that India is in Asia), 'no South Americans', 'no fats' and even 'no one under 9 inches'. He should be so lucky.

You only need to take a casual glance through the plethora of hook-up apps and dating sites to see these exclusionary terms bandied about like confetti.

Wouldn't it be a far better idea just to state the guys you are into, and not what you don't want?

Maybe a number of those who express racist sentiments wouldn't act in such a callous way in the real world. If, for example, they walked by a bar which presented pre 1970's America segregationist signs like 'No Dogs, Negroes or Mexicans', you'd hope they wouldn't enter. It's much easier to be xenophobic in cyberspace where the conversations happen with an endless deluge of avatars. It's even easier when you consider the overwhelming majority of these represents people you'll probably never come into contact with.

There are suggestions that this behaviour has manifested itself because of the fact that gay people are marginalised in society from an early age. During our formative years we are made to feel that at the very least there is something wrong with us, or even that we are freaks and sexual deviants. Being perceived this way can create a plethora of emotions, including anger, confusion, shame and alienation. It can be contended that such a harmful cocktail could lead us to subconsciously exclude specific people from dating platforms, in the way that we ourselves have been excluded.

There's also the fact that many simply use these services for instant gratification; so they spell out in stark terms what and whom they want, irrespective of causing offence to others. But wouldn't it be a far better idea just to state the guys you are into, and not what you don't want? Surely, as our community has often suffered victimisation we shouldn't project it back out there; a little bit of sensitivity wouldn't go amiss when pursuing our sexual satisfaction. Isn't it time to break this perpetuating circle of hate?

Last week's turn was none other than the living legend herself, Maisie Trollette, accompanied by Josh Mills on the keys. It was a busy turnout despite the good old British weather (rain is in our blood). Maisie sang some of her favourite songs, many of which were rousing show tunes, to an appreciative and attentive audience. The relaxed atmosphere worked perfectly with the tone of the show, in which Maisie joked, shared anecdotes and got to know her audience. She even got this reviewer onstage to fiddle with her ring (ahem). That's not the first time we've fingered a shiny ring on a Sunday night. After fifty years in the business, the UK's longest performing drag artist knows how to work a room impeccably. It felt like being out with an old friend chatting about good times and memories, such is Maisie's onstage warmth. A great night was had by all, in an institutional gay venue with a true institution of the cabaret scene. And after a much deserved standing ovation and beautiful encore we disappeared into the night...

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## Why the Taboo Around Sex and Age?

Adam Weymouth shadows performance artist Tammy WhyNot as she tours the UK with her latest show, *What Tammy Needs To Know About Getting Old and Having Sex*.

As the lights come up, Tammy WhyNot (Lois Weaver) is sat at the front of the stage, dressed in a boiler-suit, melancholic. Now in her sixties, she confides, she's been finding her urges just aren't what they used to be. "I used to think I'd always be like one of those Duracell bunnies, hopping from bed to bed," she sighs. "I thought I'd be doing it on my deathbed. But these days, I just don't feel like it."

Then the country kicks in, a pulsing bass line, and Tammy slips out of her boiler suit and into sequins. She is planning her comeback album, she tells us. It's going to be about sex and getting old, and she needs to do some research. Why the taboo around sex and age? Why can't we speak about old people having sex? Do we really think they're not?

Tammy, so the story goes, was a famous Country and Western singer until, in a moment of clarity, she packed it all in to become a famous lesbian performance artist. For the past few months Tammy has been on a tour of the UK with her latest show, *What Tammy Needs To Know About Getting Old and Having Sex*.

Weaver herself has been a leading light in the performance art world for more than 30 years, and more recently a Guggenheim winning artist and a Professor of Contemporary Performance at Queen Mary's University. Speaking to me after the show, Weaver describes Tammy as her superhero, the side of her personality that is "not afraid to fail." She has an infectious curiosity, an upfront, unashamed naivety, and people delight in opening up to her.

Each city she performs in, she spends the days leading up to the show in care homes and drop-in centres, talking to the residents about their sex lives. We hear from a 67-year-old with three boyfriends she found on the internet, a man recently widowed and an 84-year-old with a partner 18 years her junior who is still having regular sex. For us young folk, it's enlightening. Weaver believes that we don't talk about sex nearly enough, however old we are. To hear these conversations is to understand that each of us is a complete and complex individual, that all of us share the same desires and fears, whether we're twenty years old or eighty.

In Croatia she lived, as Tammy, in a retirement home for a week. "I found out they were all doing it," she laughs. "Definitely doing it. In

the hallways, in the elevators." In Britain she has found getting access much harder, getting fobbed off by managers that the residents are not interested, but when she does get inside she discovers just the opposite. "A lot of the women had all read *50 Shades of Grey*," she says. "They all really wanted to talk about that. Maybe they weren't having sex, but they weren't dead."

One care home she visited had a policy of not informing the residents when one of their members died. "There's this protection not just from a subject like sex, but from any kind of real emotion, or real life experience, once we get to a certain age," she says. "We don't really treat people like elders. We treat people like people being finished with life."

And that, for Weaver, is where the silence surrounding sex and age becomes so damaging, because when we talk about sex, it is not just about sex that we are talking. "The fact that I'm there to talk about sex, and that I'm a queer woman, that gives a sort of permissiveness," she says. "Everyone likes to get a bit naughty." But in creating that relaxed, accepting space, it allows for other conversations about the fundamentals of our lives. "It's about opening up that possibility for people to talk about loss, or desire, or longing, or intimacy."

In the end, it's about learning to accept ourselves, whatever stage of life we're at. I ask her how the conversations and performances have helped changed her own attitudes. "It's made me feel more relaxed about sex," she says. "I held onto a tension about it as I began to lose my libido. I thought is there something wrong with me? How can I fix this? And now I feel more open. I've let go of that, and consequently I do have more sexual impulses. I can feel a shift in my own ageism, of who and what I find attractive. Including myself."

Tammy, it seems, is back in town.


Co-hosted by Lisa Luxx, of subversive youth culture magazine Prowl House, the room filled up quickly with lesbians, gay men, queer beer drinkers and the in-between.

As a scratch performance

night, the onus was very much on experimentation and the ability to fuck up if needs be - so when Trish had a cosmic mind blank mid-spoken word verse, she pulled out her poem from her bra, flicked her weave, adjusted her crotch and got back into her flow. She was followed by a lovely young male songwriter singing about a girl - he skedaddled pretty quickly after realising it was a queer night - and new drag queen on the block Miss Giving, with her paean to the beauty of curtains.

The first feature of the night was the awesome Liv Wynter, the rap battle verstress who takes down misogyny and exposes it for straight male instability across the capital. The Far Right Express, a band composed of 'Nigel Farage' and his UKIP-colour clad backing singers, followed, offering satirical numbers on the topics of immigration blaming in Britain. Pure, unexpected class.

The second feature of the night was the awesome Travis



Alabanza, giving a set ranging from the political to the difficulty of giving a blowjob. Lisa Luxx roused the crowd with her ode to the female orgasm - 'have you ever met a man who doesn't know how to cum?', Ethan Mechare gained giggles with his comic tale of working as a naked cleaner, and Francis Klay was roared back

on to the stage for guitar finger-plucking and smooth crooning. The final act of the night was the stellar and awesome Naommon, a French musician giving us classic cabaret to sing us out into the night, a fitting end to the night's launch. The next NSFW will be held on Friday 19th June.

heart disease. There's also evidence that coffee protects you from Parkinson's disease and can reduce the risk of many cancers, including pancreatic, liver, breast and prostate cancer. There are over 1,000 chemicals in coffee, some of which have credible anti-cancer effects; caffeic acid can inhibit cell pathways involved in tumour growth, while cafestol stimulates antioxidants in the cells to defend themselves

No-one is suggesting that we should drink more coffee to protect us from heart disease, cancer or Parkinson's disease but if you enjoy coffee you can be certain that you are not doing yourself harm. There's strong evidence that drinking three to five cups a day (or up to 400mg/d caffeine) is not harmful at all. The reality is that coffee drinking is probably doing you a lot of good.

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
