

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## The Positive Project

Determined to Stop the Stigma, Jacob announced the launch of 'The Positive Project'. An App designed to build awareness around the causes and symptoms of HIV – The Positive Project provides HIV facts, health information and helps users locate the closest treatment centres to them. There they can connect with centres, ask questions anonymously and book appointments.

Users are also encouraged to show their support by purchasing a specially designed 'Positive Project' T-shirt, designed by Jacob, and upload a 'selfie' snap to the App. The aim is to inspire fellow users to share their own selfies, creating a sense of community and "spreading a little bit more of the right kind of positivity across the globe" says Jacob.

A percentage from each T-shirt sale go to the St Stephen's Aids Trust – which helps fund research and support for those living with HIV, as well as leading sexual health clinics, 56 Dean Street & Dean Street Express.

"I hope my app can make people feel connected and feel a little safer having access to sexual health information. I've designated a special section of the 'Where To Get Checked' feature to the transgender community too. My aim was to target those people who have been at risk of turning to sex work to fund their transition and thereby expose themselves to the HIV virus – known to be higher with sex workers. Everyone deserves the right to access to information."

# Meet Jacob

Standing at just 5 foot 6, diminutive, 22-year old London College of Fashion, UAL student, Jacob Alexander moved audiences to tears at this year's TEDxUAl talk.

Stepping out on stage, in front of whirring cameras, he announced:

"I was diagnosed with HIV on my 22nd birthday. My mum was sat next to me when I received the call. I thought of all the people who don't have support. How can we make the lives of those living with the virus better? HIV needs to make the headlines again."

## Jacob's diagnosis

Diagnosed on his birthday on 9 September 2015, Jacob has spent the last six months grappling with the truth of his diagnosis.

"It feels like a twisted joke. I proposed my final year London College of Fashion project on a Spring Summer collection designed to raise awareness and to de-stigmatise HIV. It was to be named after my own blood type, O+.

I thought it was an important cause, but it was something that happened to other people. Little did I know that three months later, I would be diagnosed with the virus myself."

Already a survivor, Jacob had thought he was done with battling his body. Born with Van der Woude syndrome – an extremely rare genetic disorder that causes mid-line defects in the body – Jacob has endured more than nine operations and procedures that have seen his entire face reconstructed. As a result of the surgeries, he has seven metal plates, 27 wire hooks and 14 screws in his face.

"I took a picture of my face every-day for three months because there was nothing for me to look at before my surgery.

The doctors sent me in blind and so I asked them to take photographs of the transformation of my face so patients would know what to expect when they walked into the operating room."

He bravely shared the photographs online and thousands of people began to follow his journey on social media. Songstress, Rita Ora got behind him and liked one of his photographs on Instagram, quickly amassing over 50,000 likes.

Intent on moving forward and forging a career as a menswear designer, Jacob has struggled with the onset of this new battle.

"My HIV symptoms came around eight weeks after my body contracted the virus. Then came hell. I could literally feel the virus spreading through my body. I developed rashes, sores, aching joints and ensured drenching night sweats for months. Even freckles fell off from my skin. I don't feel like it's my skin anymore or my hair or my body. In fact, I don't feel like me anymore.

Since my diagnosis, I've struggled with depression and have felt my life unravel. I feel I have seen the true value of my worth as I have witnessed the stigma of HIV first-hand. My best friend rejected me, sharing jokes with his friends about my HIV status. I was shocked the day he bought his own fridge for his room, scared that I would "infect" his food. It showed just how deep the ignorance runs around HIV – you can't transmit a live virus like HIV through touch.

But in a positive moment, my cousin Elizabeth hugged me and told me I was strong.

'You can turn this curse into a blessing and help others,' she told me. My parents and family and friends rallied around me and showed me unconditional support.

From the moment I came out when I was 12 years old, my parents have supported me. My mum was there with me when I received the call telling me I was HIV Positive and has been there, along with my Dad, through every hurdle. I don't think I could have more amazing parents. When I told my boyfriend, Gary, he promised he would be there for me every step of the way and nine months later he stands proudly by my side. I've never been in

love like this before. It was because of them that I knew I had to do something to help other people living with HIV."

These days, Jacob is open about his diagnosis and talks freely about his condition. At the outward mention of HIV, he is greeted with onlooker's stares and visible looks of discomfort.

"You can't imagine the level of discrimination I have felt on daily basis," he says. "People protect their children. There is a stigma to HIV and a fear that runs deep. Education and support is key.

I wanted to use my passion for design to inspire people to show their support and know they are not alone. Just like we've changed our attitudes to gender and sexuality and mental health – it's now time for people to get educated about HIV.

I want to invite everyone to join ranks in my #ALXNDRARMY to Stop the Stigma and support The Positive Project."

# PrEP Down

Following last week's announcement from the National Health Service that they will not be commissioning the highly-effective HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis medication PrEP, we spoke to three experts on what this decision will mean for the community going forward and what you can do to challenge it.

I'm shocked, disappointed and saddened that NHS England is ducking any responsibility to provide PrEP. The UK should be leading the way in HIV prevention, but now we are falling behind. At the recent LGBT reception in Downing Street, the Prime Minister made a commitment to do all that is within his power to speed access to PrEP. Adding PrEP to our HIV prevention armoury could have the power to turn the tide on new HIV infections. This would have been a great legacy for any Government. But once again, that opportunity has been dismissed. Every year thousands of gay and bisexual men in the UK are diagnosed with HIV. In many of these cases, if PrEP had been available, infection could have been avoided and the overall bill for HIV treatment and care could be reduced. Currently the UK spends about fifty times more on treatment and care for people living with HIV than it spends on preventing new infections. Limiting our prevention options, leading to more people becoming infected with HIV, only leads to greater costs down the line. PrEP is not a magic bullet. It isn't going to prevent all future HIV infections, not least because there are many who won't want to use it. However, if we are able to utilise all of the weapons in our prevention armoury, which includes PrEP, condom use and work to ensure people with HIV are diagnosed promptly and able to access treatment, we could bring about an end to new infections within a generation.

We've seen early indicators of significant success in cities such as San Francisco which have allocated substantial resources towards cutting new HIV infections. This work combines early initiation of treatment, community-based

prevention messages highlighting the ongoing role of condoms in improving sexual health and PrEP. PrEP isn't for everybody. There are a number of gay men who, by their behaviour, are likely to become HIV-positive in the next year. They are not hard to identify. They are showing up at GUM clinics on a regular basis with a range of STIs. For these men, PrEP could make the difference between sero-converting, or remaining HIV-negative. That's the difference between a lifetime of treatment and care costs and a much smaller bill for providing an intervention when they most need it. HIV and health charities, professional medical associations and gay activists have come together to demand PrEP. Now is not the time to condemn the choices of others. We should be wary about any divisions within our community being used to delay access to PrEP. Our fight must be to ensure that those who will clearly benefit from PrEP have access to it, not be against them for needing it. HIV infection has been a burden on the gay, bisexual and trans communities since the 1980s. Young gay men have never known a time before HIV. We now have all the tools that we need to bring an end to new infections. We must not waste this opportunity.

Many readers of QX will know about PrEP, that it is almost 100% effective when used correctly in preventing HIV transmission. Gay men have been waiting and longing for an additional prevention option to add to condom use for years. And now it has arrived. But we can't have it.

In March this year NHS England suddenly announced their decision to pull PrEP from the decision-making process for the funding and provision of new health policies, only a couple of

months before an expected decision in June. NHS England claimed they had, at the last minute, come to the view they could not lawfully commission PrEP in this way. At NAT we disagreed (they already commission PrEP that way ..) and began legal proceedings. This made NHS England promise to reconsider and we suspended our legal action. But on 31 March NHS England reconsidered ... and came to the same negative conclusion.

No alternative process to commission PrEP has been identified by the Government or the NHS. We are in limbo - the only thing on the table is £2 million over two years for an additional 500 gay men to access PrEP. This is only a fraction of the gay men at high risk of HIV acquisition who need PrEP. It also ignores the needs of heterosexuals at high risk. We still believe that NHS England have got the law wrong and we are therefore planning legal action. At the same time we are calling on the Government to bring together all stakeholders round a table to work out how to make PrEP available as soon as possible to all who need it. At the moment we have chaos and confusion, whilst every day a further eight gay men in the UK become HIV positive. This cannot continue. The Government and the NHS need to prove that they care about gay men's health and act now to provide PrEP comprehensively and fairly to those at high risk of HIV

The NHS's decision last week to once again deny their responsibility to provide healthcare to those at risk of HIV is a huge blow to the LGBT, African and HIV communities. So far PrEP has been delayed from being made available by 2 years, in that time 12,000 people in the UK have acquired HIV whilst transmission rates continue to rise. PrEP, condoms and anti-retroviral treatment as prevention are all the tools we need to end the HIV pandemic within a generation, but because of government failure around the world, HIV is still devastating millions of people's lives with no end in sight, our NHS is now a world leader in these failings. In the USA, PrEP has been available for 4 years now and has shown staggering reductions in transmission rates. The NHS spends less than 2% on HIV prevention

compared to what it spends on HIV treatment. If they did the maths and invested more in things like PrEP and HIV education, the bill for treatment would plummet. Now PrEP looks unlikely to be made available within the next 12-18 months, adding another 6000 - 9000 infections. This is completely unacceptable and the time to fight against this is now. 



**Donna Summer**


What she did Last Summer: got caught bad mouthing the gay boys for leaving her cake out in the rain.

If you've never seen Myra perform, I'd be inclined to ask if you've been living under a rock somewhere. She is one of the funniest and most talented drag cabaret acts to come through in the last few years, her razor-sharp wit and humour will have you roaring with laughter the minute she saunters on to the stage.

Myra arrives at this year's London Wonderground festival with a show about her favourite subject, herself. Myra loves Myra. There's no getting away from it. Self AdMyra is a show all about accepting that she is a fan of herself, less an exercise in self-help and more a testimony of ego she is taking her rightful place amongst her AdMyras.

**Trevor Ashley's Liza's Back!**

**London Wonderground**

A rare opportunity to see the acclaimed Australian actor and performer Trevor Ashley back in London as Liza for the first time since 2013. Ashley's Liza (on an E) toured across Australia, Europe and in London's West End to glowing reviews.

This time round in Liza's Back! (is broken) we are treated to an exploration of all the great Broadway roles that Minnelli should have played over the last forty years. Liza is direct from rehab, and with a 7-piece big band to boot.

Having performed in Les Miserable and Hairspray Ashley knows a thing or two about musical theatre. And as Liza he has the exaggerated performance style, nuances and delirium down to a tee.



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
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The release of *Shortbus* arguably marked a turning point in how people viewed the relationship between art and pornography. Yes it IS eyeroll-inducing when people in warehouses in Hackney Wick point at a sepia-filtered shot of Grimes' pussy and protest "but it's not porn, it's ART! It's TASTEFUL!"

Increasingly there's a lot of hot air and pretension around the issue. *LOOK AT ME, I'VE TAKEN AN OVEREXPOSED SHOT OF A CUCUMBER UP MY ARSE*. But buried somewhere under all the self-congratulatory Tumblr generation smut is something tangible. There IS a differentiation between porn and art, and *Shortbus* is one of the few creations to bridge that gap.

With an indie vibe but actually quite a high budget and glossy production, John Cameron Mitchell's comedy/drama revolves around the intertwining lives of a host of troubled, eccentric characters seeking sex and love in New York City. It's got straight sex, gay sex and bisexual sex. It's got rimming (gasp!), actual visible penetration, and ejaculation. By many people's definition, that means it's pornography. But it has real heart, soul and humour, as well as underlying messages and sociopolitical implications. I'm not saying porn films don't have that too, but it's rare (Mickey Taylor, any thoughts?).



It's all pleasingly honest and grown up. What I love most about it was that it shrugs off one of the things that irritates me most about cinema – pussyfooting around sex, or implying it with laboriously cheesy double entendres. We've all done it, for christ's sake, just show us the fucking money. It also says a lot about modern society that films which feature people getting shot in the head are released on a weekly basis, but release one with an erect penis in it, and there's international outcry.

Another great thing about the film is the acting. Sook-Yin Lee does one of the most emotive and underrated turns I've ever seen as troubled sex therapist Sofia, while the brilliant Paul Dawson flawlessly portrays the

complications and various ins and outs (so to speak) of being in a gay open relationship. Interestingly, neither actor went on to do a great amount with their career afterwards, which perhaps speaks of stigma towards this sort of thing in the industry.

Anyway, *Shortbus* is a wonderful, important little film. If there were more films like *Shortbus*, perhaps things would be a bit better. Perhaps schools would actually teach sex education rather than playing a cartoon and shoving a condom on a banana and leaving it at that. Perhaps porn performers and sex workers would be treated better. Perhaps people would stop thinking sepia shots of Grimes' vagina were edgy.

# SEX-WORK SEDUCTRESS!

# W

hat's the total kiss of death to even the fiercest drag queens? Try audience indifference, darlings – no queen alive survives the mass glazing of utterly bored eyeballs! It's a killer conundrum even more damaging for drag sex-workers – what hope's left when even bog-standard looks wither and die and punters stop paying? Frankly, no amount of slap imaginable combats

the sexual invisibility of increasing age, as uninterested eyes slide past but never, **ever** linger!

So pity poor Stella, the true-life, joint Victorian diva and escort celebrated in Neil Bartlett's latest excavation of hidden gay history. Arrested in full drag at a West End theatre with her friend Fanny, Stella was charged with procuring sodomy for profit in a sensational trial. But in a twist worthy of Tim Burton's demented, *Alice in Wonderland*, Stella was acquitted – the jury couldn't even **imagine** having anal sex for kicks!

Poor Victorian England – psychologically, it was a kink-free wasteland, with a deluded Queen Victoria staying wilfully ignorant of scissor sisters indulging lesbian lusts. But if an insanely repressed middle class dismissed any slightest hint of sex as 'beastliness', the upper and lower classes adored pure filth. I mean, come on – who'd really yawn through Church on Sundays and endure prissy, domestic torture when hot cocks in frocks blatantly minced on stage?

No wonder music-halls doubled as perfect stalking-grounds for gin-palace prozzies – theatre and whores were as perfect a marriage as penises and spit-roasts. So, quite fittingly, *Stella* is running in Hoxton Hall, London's last surviving, vintage music hall. Tall, narrow and eerily claustrophobic, even the stage barely has room to breathe, and it's no stretch to imagine Victorian oiks agog at the insolent beauty of a prick-teasing queen in silks. But, like sex itself, *Stella* is a slow, teasing reveal to ultimate mystery, beginning with a gaunt, middle-aged actor in character on stage as we enter.


The atmosphere's tense, electric, more thrilling than a first, unseen kiss of an eager Johnson in a freshly-entered glory-hole. Instantly, we feel a toxic humidity reminiscent of Tennessee Williams' fatally blooming madwomen, as this older Stella – Richard Cant - touchingly exposes her bittersweet revelations.

Typically - with blatant, trans-genre genius - Bartlett's script sticks an immediate finger in multiple pies, blending melodrama, police procedural and true confession. Yes, it's CSI meets Ru Paul's drag-race, as Bartlett, invariably, treats gay sex with the besotted reverence of an involuntary convert to an unsuspected religion. →



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But there's much more to *Stella* than delirious intoxication with her tragically impermanent glamour. A 'one-man show for two bodies,' the play cross-cuts ferociously between Stella's older and younger selves with the whiplash, cinematic brilliance of prime, coke-fuelled Scorsese. If aged Stella laments her decreasing beauty and decreasing admirers, ditzy ingénue Stella – bewitchingly played by Oscar Batterham – basks incandescent in her punters' sexual frenzies. Screw dumb exposition – Bartlett skewers more emotion in this dazzling, 60-minute montage than *Coronation Street* in 60 years!

Partly, that's down to virtuoso theatricality. *Stella*, initially, begins with a thundering knock at a private door, a sharp metaphor for intrusive bigotry. But author Bartlett's eloquent indictment of social erasure isn't confined to gay, gender-variant Stella. Leaving no stone of past, intersectional prejudice unturned, an unspeaking, black actor – David Carr – moves onstage as a second, excluded power behind England's exploitative throne. A raw, still bleeding political wound, it's a masterstroke that lifts *Stella* from fluffy diversion to scathing, social critique.

Gee, what's not to like? Quite magnificently, Bartlett's fused the forbidden thrills of Catholic confession – telling intimate secrets to a stranger on your knees in a darkened box(!) – to a sense of theatre as grand, community closure and public exorcism. Finally, *Stella*'s fabulously improbable legacy – dragging up **whatever** the cost – has received the posthumous acclaim it so seductively demands!


## Lynne

Like, really. What else can you actually say?




## Mary Brady aka Steve's Mum

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# YMCA Positive Health Programme

**IF YOU'RE LIVING WITH HIV** in London and don't know about Positive Health then it's time to get with the programme, which is 'positive' in both senses of the word. Run by central London's biggest gym, the YMCA Club close to Tottenham Court Road station, it's a dedicated exercise referral scheme for individuals living with HIV that is designed, says Positive Health programme co-ordinator Victoria Brown, to improve "fitness, self-esteem and quality of life."

Catering for all levels of ability, the initial 12-week programme includes an assessment, a gym induction, a personalised fitness programme that's based on your goals and aspirations, sessions with a personal trainer and access to a weekly series of dedicated Positive Health classes that include Qi Gong, badminton, yoga, aerobics, core strength classes, meditation and swimming lessons. These are not only a great way to kick-start your fitness regime but also a fun means of building an extended family of new HIV positive friends.

"The programme gives people the confidence and knowledge to exercise safely," says Brown, "and it also helps to combat health conditions associated with HIV such as neuropathy and lipodystrophy and those associated with ageing," she says, "such as osteoporosis and cardiovascular problems."

The initial 12-week section of the programme finishes with a second fitness

assessment where participants can chart physical changes as well as any improvements in health and wellbeing. A subsidised gym membership is then up for grabs, which comes with continuous support so that exercise becomes part of your new healthier, and hopefully happier, lifestyle. As part of this, Positive Health members can also book

trips, picnics in Regents Park and even a weekend in Sussex."

For instance, some members have signed up for the Thrive organisation's free wellbeing workshop on 2 July or snapped up £10 tickets to see West End hit *The Bodyguard: The Musical* starring the fantastic Beverley Knight on 27 July. Positive

Health members are kept in the loop via a fortnightly email newsletter that carries details of upcoming class and events.

To register for the Positive Health scheme you need to obtain a Patient Referral Form from your HIV consultant. The initial 12-week Positive Health course costs £2.10 per visit at weekends and during weekday off-peak hours (6.30am to 3.45pm Mon-Fri) or £5.20 during peak hours. On completion of the 12-week course, there's one-off £20 joining fee for the YMCA Club and monthly membership costs £24 off-peak and £47

peak for Positive Health scheme members. It's pay-as-you-go so there's no rolling contracts to worry about. Concessionary and older adult's memberships are also available, costing £30 a year and then £2.10 per visit.
