




# **LICENSE TO KILL?**

You may have heard recently of the plight of the famous gay pub The Joiner's Arms on Hackney Road. New licensing proposals seek to restrict its opening hours from 4am on the weekends to 12.30am every night of the week, effectively killing its main business revenue. But all over London right now there have recently been licensing reviews, often in areas with a large concentration of gay venues, such as Dalston and Vauxhall. QX decided to get to the heart of what's going on, try and ascertain why, and how it could affect the capital's nightlife scene...

Since it was abruptly announced a few weeks ago that the Met police had requested a review of its licensing hours from Tower Hamlets Council, the campaign to save The Joiner's Arms has soared from strength to strength. 2,500 people have signed the online petition and many of its regular customers have joined in the effort to raise awareness, such as organising letter-writing nights to Tower Hamlets. The thing is, they say, The Joiner's is not just a pub, it is a nightlife community.

David speaks of how his pub brings people together, not just as a safe haven for the LGBT residents living in the East End, but also for nationalities – at one point they had Palestinians and Israelis working together behind the bar, unired by The Joiner's quintessential charm. Ex-staff speak happily of David throwing dinner in the pub on Christmas Day for those employees who couldn't go back home to be with their families.

We contacted Tower Hamlets Council to contribute to this article, but they still hadn't replied by the time we went to press.


The police's involvement in the Joiner's Arms case is allegedly because of a spate of mobile thefts at the venue, and a fight that occurred on the street outside last year. Up in Dalston, it is also stated that the police are behind Hackney Council's proposed clampdown on new late night licenses in the area.

'The overwhelming majority of licensees take their responsibility very seriously indeed,' said Matthew Horne, Hackney's police borough commander in a statement on his Tumblr account. 'Some don't. Some choose profits first and the wellbeing and safety of their patrons second. That's when we step in and ask for a review of their license conditions. This may mean improving security and CCTV or varying the opening hours.'

Yet the Joiner's Arms has recently installed an entirely new CCTV system at the local police's bequest, and now the force has still gone ahead with calling for a licensing review. Ultimately, restricting the venues' opening hours isn't going to stop the crime that might have occurred at these venues. Increased security and CCTV might do – restrict the venue's hours and the crime will simply move elsewhere, on to the streets or to another venue.

A large focus behind the moves in Vauxhall seems to be drugs. Councillor Jack Hopkins, cabinet member for safer and stronger neighbourhoods, is quoted as saying: 'If [venues'] operations bring drug-dealing, antisocial behaviour or nuisance to an area... We have a responsibility to residents and other businesses to intervene.'

Proposals that have hit the headlines in particular have been suggested measures to limit trading hours to 2am. These kinds of licensing restrictions do not appear to be the answer to tackling drugs or residents' health in relation to drugs. As with crime, stop the clubs and the drugs will simply move elsewhere. The problem is not the clubs; the problem, where there may be one in London's gay scene, is a particular mindset and an appetite and restricting licensing is not going to deter this mentality.




Lambeth Council were, incidentally, strangely economical with their answers to requests for information in the writing of this piece. They replied on behalf of Councillor Hopkins that 'there is no current licensing review, nor proposals for one in Vauxhall', omitting to mention that the public consultation for a licensing review had just recently closed on October 7th. When I asked whether the results of this public consultation may affect licensing in the area, I received no reply at the time of going to press.

Accusations that this is an anti-gay issue in Vauxhall were dismissed by Mark Oakley of The Eagle: 'I feel strongly that this is an anti-social behaviour issue, NOT an anti-gay issue and would not want it to become hijacked as such. It is important for all of us who rely on the nighttime economy for our livelihoods, to be united in our aim to keep the area clean, safe and to remain a destination that people feel safe to visit.'

What all of us – residents, landlords, police, clubbers, councils – might need to remember is that there are two communities in each borough of London, that of the day and the night, and neither one should be unfairly singled out. Even in Soho, many nighttime businesses have had alleged run-ins with Westminster Council. Chris Amos of Manbar states: 'Where Manbar is located we actually provide safety to this part of Westminster. Our security team have even caught pick-pocketers... I do feel the council could actually be more cooperative in helping us improve and grow our businesses.'

Much of London's vibrancy and greatness comes from its existence as a twenty-four hour city and, whilst unfortunately crime and drugs may be sometimes attendant on its evening scene, to strip it of that evening scene is to dilute its richness. Keeping us all safe and happy should always be a priority, so let's work together to target crime and help problematic drug-users, whilst not letting our venues become regretful casualties of either bureaucratic statistics or a small minority's foul play.

THE IRREPRESSIBLES are a band dedicated not only to creating wonderful, inclusive music, but also to furthering the cause of LGBT people across the globe, from the UK to Russia. With the release of their 'Nude: Landscapes' EP this week and current UK tour, we caught up with lead singer Jamie McDermott to find out more about their unique and admirable story...



#### Tell us a little about yourself and The **Irrepressibles**

I'm a writer, singer, composer and The Irrepressibles is meant to be a musical project without barriers in terms of genre, high art and low art. I just love pop music and feel that pop music should be culturally political and to speak out and be the force of change. We've been formed now for twelve years, roundabouts.

#### How did the band come about?


I didn't want to change myself or change my accent or try and become something to be accepted by the middle classes, but I wanted to do something that wasn't just a band with bass and guitar so I started The Irrepressibles. We worked with orchestral instruments and I couldn't write for them, like scores, but I would sing the parts and create the music, and that's how the first album 'Mirror, Mirror', came about.

#### What can we expect with the 'Nude: Landscapes' tour?

We're performing in small churches with real pianos, violins and cellos, octave-pedals and loop-pedals, expanding something that's really minimal. There's an 'Always on My Mind' cover I did an arrangement for with just voice and pedal, expanding into a sense of time and place and the memories of that person and the times you had. We're using fragrances and sound effects to create a sense of emotive connection. This project, for me, is about quantifying and emotionally connecting a wider audience to gay love, and help a greater understanding of what's beautiful about that love.

Are you trying for greater integration of gay and straight communities through art?

Absolutely. Often people say 'oh, there's more to you than being gay.' But there is as much an aesthetic of feeling a uniqueness of gay expression as there is black expression; a history of fight and difference, we are all different and we're different within the gay community as well. That complexity and that difference within the gay community needs to be expressed. I feel it's very important that artists are strong and forward with their sexuality because young people in particular need to feel like it's actually pretty cool to be gay. I would love there to be a time when people are like: 'Oh, I'd love to be like that,



that's the coolest thing ever, I wish I was gay.' And this is all represented in the new EP? With Nude, the main record, it was about telling this gay story honestly. We made a series of videos: 'New World' about gay bullying and finding emancipation; 'Arrow' about the struggle of sexuality and finding acceptance;

and 'Two Men in Love' about long-term love with somebody and the album itself was in some places dark, slightly nu-wave baroque, and in some places very orchestral. With these three EPs we're basically splitting it into three worlds, so the first record 'Nude: Landscapes' is a minimal symphonic sound with reworks of album songs and new tracks.

Sounds amazing. Have you ever encountered difficulty from the music industry for your outspokenness of gay

Yeah, I have, but I wouldn't go into that. I saw that even Google and YouTube restricted the age on your videos?

It's dark because when I made the videos for 'New World' and 'Two Men in Love' and 'Arrow', there are kids that need to see the beauty of being gay and might be gay themselves. For it to be restricted to be over eighteen to watch it when there's nothing sexually explicit in it is dark. What you're doing is actively making a choice inflicting suffering on these young kids by them not seeing their culture.

#### This ties in with the Russian debate, doesn't it?

We actually played in front of 5,000 people at a free festival in Moscow and showed the video to 'Arrow' at the end. There's video footage of the reaction, some people are looking shocked in disbelief, but I went to see the crowd after the concert and there was lots of positivity from both gay and straight people. It's so sad though, to have met those people and the resistance, and to think of their experience now, and it's just one meeting, because I don't think we'll get into the country again after what we did.

# South London Chemsex study





My friend Matthew, who had run London Friend and had helped Antidote through a rough patch, asked me to march with them at Gay Pride several years ago. Even though the crew was a rag-tag bunch of chain-smoking drunk catty queens, I was touched by the amazing things they did to help people in need. Drug and alcohol harm reduction and prevention, safe sex education and HIV support groups and even support for

transgendered people transitioning; this was all the devoted work that keeps our LGBTQ society from coming apart. How could I not help and encourage others to join in?

We love getting nutted in a club and for a good cause! This will be your third 'Charity Monster', can you give us one of your favourite memories from the first two?

Meeting Kelis at the first one in NYC was a total highlight for me. I saw her heading down the escalator in the Atlantic City Hotel it was held in and raced down the escalator to talk to her: "I'm Larry Tee, the writer of Supermodel by RuPaul, and I'm your biggest fan!" She must've thought I was mad! But she was kind and sweet. Also, when I got caught in the middle of a bitch fight between Perez Hilton and Jeffrey Star before La Roux performed where Jeffrey told me he wanted to see Perez die in a very unkind way. Seems Perez had said he was talentless. I mean Perez said Will.i.am was gay, and that certainly wasn't very true. Who knows?

Ahh, there's better than a shameless celeb bitch-off. Your usual venue is East Bloc and last year's Halloween special was at XOYO, so we're especially excited to see how things are going to be done at Aquarium.

Who doesn't love a pool party? And Aquarium allows us to stay open much later than we could at XOYO, so we went for the late-night afterhours madness for this one. As for surprises, we always have them whether they are Glyn of Sink the Pink's production numbers or the biggest supermodel on Earth. We have some of the coolest acts around on 'serious music' labels like Kitsune joining us for a number and then have the trashiest bitch on the block perform. We like high-brow and low-brow talent and that collision of energy always makes for some surprises and laughs.



'IN CONVERSATION WITH... AGENDER: POPPY JACKSON + NINA ARSENAULT'

Jperformance s p a c e [ is an artist led non-profit organisation that provides studio and project space, aiming to cultivate live work that critically and physically pushes the boundaries of body and space. This has lead to its recent 'In Conversation...' series of pieces, stretched across three weeks in a disused industrial estate of Hackney Wick, an area of London fast becoming a Berlin-like mecca for exciting, experimental art and theatre.

Last week was the creative residency of gender-based artist Poppy Jackson and transgender performance icon Nina Arsenault. Arsenault funded \$150,000 worth of cosmetic surgery through her work in the sex trade before concentrating her extensive powers upon performance and exploring the idea of femininity in modern culture. In Unit 6 of Hamlet Industrial Estate they created together an intriguing, multi-disciplinary installation



piece that uniquely raised questions and provoked thought through its vision.

Both performers were inside a specially constructed space of four walls, through which the spectators could only peer at through windows. Jackson poured water into a pail and began to shave her legs, Arsenault knelt staring at herself in a mirror. The room inside was warmly lit in contrast to the shadows we stood in outside, looking in. Trees without leaves grew in the corners, four laptops under four windows played different videos of both artists; hardcore fisting porn was projected upon one wall, possibly starring Arsenault herself; and on the facing edifice

she was speaking an everrepeating tale of her previous loves, one of whom lifted her off the ground by her neck.

This is quite clearly not traditional theatre and it is not structured in a traditional theatre way: there are loose start and end times, people can come and go as they want, you can stay for the whole four hours or just catch 15 minutes. Purists may miss the narrative lean, others may scoff. 



### 5. Arrow

One of The Irrepressibles' most dearly loved tracks, the heavily homoerotic video for which they showed when they played a Russian film festival, Arrow begins with an intricate piano riff, entwined with other sounds, before building incrementally through orchestra and the sound of McDermott's spiralling vocals to a moving finale.

### 6. Two Men in Love (Live at The Limehouse)

An ode to the honest beauty of gay love begins with a slow build-up, as if the fragile beginning of a delicate relationship blossoming, before the whirlwind of euphoria hits in; 'there's a strange love inside,' roars the opalescent falsetto, 'it's getting louder, louder, louder... I'm in love, I'm in love, I'm in love' as the music soars and slices about him. 'We're just two men in love.' Standout track.

### 7. (The Sea)

A short interlude of the waves lapping and hitting the shore.

### 8. Ship

An energetic shanty-like song flies along with an involving rhythm of big drum beats and symphonic surf.

### 9. Needing Release From You

Perhaps the most immediately different track on the EP, 'Needing Release From You' does not suffer for that fact. It begins with a subtle guitar rhythm, as the lyrics whisper 'trying to make my heart beat just like your heart, needing release from you.'

### 10. (The Rain)

Rain falls for half a minute in the third of the elemental interludes.

### II. Always on My Mind

A song everybody knows crafted in a manner few would have expected to experience it in. All the poignancy and sad beauty of the loss-laden lyrics are caught and illuminated by this newly wrought arrangement. Wonderful.

# GERMAN M) ENGINEERING

Dating apps are a penny a dozen these days, but Germany's latest export aims to fill a gap (no pun intended) in the 'gay app' market. Anthony Gilét dissects the biggest German thing to get gay men excited since Heidi Klum...



### What is it?

nearox is the first app that promises to offer gay men dating mixed with social networking. Founder Heiko Fuchs describes nearox as "Facebook meets dating." OK, yes we're intrigued, especially as the closest we've had thus far is the random friend request from a ratchet queen half way up the country; raaaaaincheck. And also now we haven't gotta worry about our nan seeing us tagged in a photo sweating our manginas off at East Bloc.

### How does it work?

Like other dating apps before this one, you can view users based on how close they are to you. Unlike other dating apps, you also have a timeline feature where you can see what other users are up to; including check-ins, posts and events. You can follow people's profiles so that they then appear on your Social Wall and your profile is more extensive than standard apps.

### What are the features?

Creators call it "German (M) engineering". Clever. You can have up to 15 profile pictures — meaning that you'll have a better idea of who you're meeting before you trek halfway across London to find a bloke, two stone heavier, fives years older and a foot shorter than advertised. You can filter searches, have up to 200 interests, listen to the radio, rank users, see who's visited and there are free push notifications — so you won't miss that quick nosh with a gorgeous hunk who's only in town for one night. #Winning

### Who uses it?

Currently – a whole load of Germans. But fit ones from what we can see. So, hopefully, the calibre will remain reasonably high as it moves across the water (and into our pants).

### How is it different?

nearox Prime (the subscription version) includes a feature called DeleteMe. We already like the sound of it. But no, it's not just a simple block feature for hideous trolls with hungry holes - DeleteMe allows you to send an image that automatically gets deleted after it's viewed. Queue countless gays across the country no longer afraid to get their cock out without the pictures going viral. StealthMe is another one of the features; this one allowing you to wallow in your guilty stalker pleasures, by searching for them anonymously. nearox also claims to have a longer chat history, and that their subscription versions are cheaper than competitors.

### When can you get it?

nearox is available free from the App Store, with parties up and down the UK to promote the launch. London, Brighton and Manchester will all be on their hit list.

According to app stores, nearox quickly became Germany's most popular gay app.

Hi Dr Alex.

Over the last few years I have picked up Giardia several times. I assume it's because I love to rim guys - it's the main way I get off. I sometime go to saunas and can rim upward of I0 guys a night. But each time I get it I am really unwell for a few days and now I worry about it whenever I am with a new guy. Is there anything I can do or take to prevent me getting it in the first place? Thanks,

Thanks for writing in.

Giardiasis is an infection of the small bowel and causes diarrhoea that usually lasts a week or more, along with abdominal cramps, bloating, flatulence, fatigue, or weight loss. The stools are usually very very smelly and have a pale greasy appearance. Symptoms usually develop one two two weeks after exposure but infection without symptoms is also common. So, yes it's a nasty infection to pick up. Thankfully, it is treatable with a single dose or short course of antibiotics.

Typically it is spread by eating food contaminated by the unwashed hands of an infected person or by drinking groundwater polluted by the faeces of infected animals such as dogs and beavers. It has been considered a tropical disease but is becoming more common in developed countries, especially among gay men. This is because of the risk of exposure to faecal matter during anal sex, but more so from rimming.

So, the more guys you rim the greater the chance that you will rim one that has giardia so one option would be to rim less guys. Making sure the ass you rim is clean is a good idea, but obviously the more vigorously you rim a guy the greater the chances are that you will have contact with faeces. A final option would be to use a barrier when riming. A dental dam, a condom cut down one side (flat piece of latex), or non-microwaveable plastic wrap (microwaveable is porous) are each barrier methods that can significantly reduce the risks.

Remember too that it is not just Giardia that you can pick up. Other bacteria can be present in faeces along with the virus of Hepatitis A. Also, through rimming you can pick up or pass on herpes or syphilis. But rimming is believed to a negligiblerisk activity for HIV transmission as the virus is not present in faeces. There is a theoretical risk that the presence of blood in the rectum (especially as a result of fingering, fisting, or use of sex toys) can pose a risk of infection for the person doing the rimming, especially if they have bleeding gums or gum disease.
